### **Fall Sports Review**



The OBI girls' volleyball team beat all known school records with their 18-7 winning season. The most wins on record for OBI volleyball was 10 in 2002. Another season highlight was defeating Clay county for the first time since 2005 and

winning both games against Clay for the first time in regular season play.

This was Coach Allie Valldeperas' second season as head coach of volleyball. Her objective has been to help her young team "mature up" and build a foundation of skilled players. She noted that the varsity team this year was still very young, ranging from 8th-11th graders. Coach Valldeperas observed an increase in both skills and "mental toughness" this season. She explained, "Now, if one girl is having a bad day, they pull together as a team and play the game."

Thanks to a donation from a parent, the team benefited from some new equipment including a strike setter and a complete net system. Several high school boys volunteered to come to Saturday practices to "spike" balls for the girls to return. "We were trying to take it to the next level, and the boys were very willing to spike those balls hard!" Valldeperas laughed.

The summer 10-day Intensive volleyball camp attended by some of the players had an obvious impact on the team's skills. "Camp helped with their individual abilities, like working



through bad serves & hitting. Compared to last year, they had a lot more control of the ball," said Valldeperas. This year's varsity starters were Madison Gritton, Madison Wilson, Isabella Valldeperas, Katy Schroeder and Leighann Truesdale.



The OBI boys' soccer team achieved a winning record of 8-5-1 and a second place finish in our district. They scored 57 goals, an average of 4.1 goals per game. Coach Michael Hawley added, "Even more

impressive is that 55 of the 57 goals scored were assisted by another player. This highlights the outstanding teamwork and skill of our team."

Outstanding senior leadership

and great supporting play from several underclassmen contributed to their solid season. Top goal scorers were: Issac Nuquay with 15 goals, Baslieal Rago with 12 goals, Ramses Cruz



**Nathaniel** and Muchiri both with nine goals. Rago, Nuguay and Cruz were also top assist givers. Hawley noted, "We had terrific goalkeeping play from first year player and starter Cody Wells."

## Spring 2016 ACT DATES February 11 ~ April 8

The ACT is administered on the OBI campus. You must register online by logging on to your existing ACT student account or by creating a new account at: www.act.org. You must register six weeks ahead of the test date. For example: January 13, 2017 is the deadline for the February 11, 2017 test.

Practice tests are available at the Guidance Office. Students may also benefit from this online source:

www.actstudent.org/testprep

The cost of the standard ACT test is \$42.50 (standard, non-writing). If a student registers here on campus with the guidance office, the fee will be billed to the student's OBI account.

The guidance office prefers students create their own ACT account and register and pay for the test online. Just make sure to print the ticket (with uploaded photo) and have the student turn in a copy to the guidance office.

**Service Hours:** If your student has any questions about the service hours required for graduation, have them see Mrs. Kathryn Jaspersen in the guidance office. When a student completes service hours, he/she must pick up from Mrs. Jaspersen the OBI Community Service Form, which is a 4x6 card that looks like this:
