

Though it was a hectic week, hosting the tournament provided a great opportunity for OBI athletes to enjoy the excitement of a packed gym during the post-season games. In addition to the proceeds earned from the tournament, we were able to



make hundreds of people, many who have never visited the OBI campus, aware of our unique Christian school and ministry.

Because 2018 is the 100th anniversary of Kentucky high school basketball, OBI Athletic Director **Todd Parkhouse** appreciated that a historic gym like Sparks was the venue for the tournament.
