Ken and Judy Conaway have been volunteering at OBI since 2006. They serve about 15 weeks each year on missions projects, mostly in Alabama, but they have traveled to 14 different states, including Alaska and Hawaii. Ken added, "OBI is a way we can do affordable foreign missions. We can see that many students are Muslim. We know that many profess Jesus while they're here and some of them will continue following Jesus when they go back home."

Buzz Brewer and his wife, Marinan, served at OBI each year from 2007 until 2019, when health issues prevented their travel. They learned about the ALCOM when a group came to renovate a church in their town. The group coordinator at the time, Jake Carroll, invited the Brewers to join them on an upcoming trip to OBI.
