# **Walker Athletic Complex Dedication**





"My grandfather dedicated his life to Christian education through OBI. I'm sure his heart is right here with us in Oneida." —Bob Walker

The dedication ceremony for the **Susan and Bob Walker** Athletic Complex was held on August 21, 2023 ahead of the first home soccer game played on the new synthetic turf field. The first major project of the planned Athletic Complex, the new track and field was made possible by the Walkers' generous donation in 2020. They are pictured above with their son, **Owen Walker**, and OBI president **Larry** (OBI '93) and **Angie** (OBI '91) **Gritton**.

President Gritton shared the story of Bob Walker's historic family ties to OBI. His grandfather, John Henry Walker, was OBI's first college-educated teacher and an answer to prayer for OBI's founder, James A. Burns. Walker married the daughter of Martha Coldiron Hogg who donated the land upon which the school

was built. Gritton described the project development, including the impact that the record-breaking February 2021 flood had on the planned elevation of the track and field. As he introduced the Walkers, Gritton stated, "OBI is grateful for your family's long history with OBI, and we are grateful for your generosity, friendship and partnership."



The OBI soccer team played and won their first game on the new field. Fans enjoyed the new seating, concessions and parking!

### **Meet our Principal**



Joseph Scull, III is the OBI principal for 2023-2024. "Joe" and his wife, Beverly, taught at OBI from 2003-2018. Their youngest of two children, Suze, graduated with OBI's Class of 2007. Their son, Joseph, IV, followed his parents to Oneida and served for a year as a houseparent at OBI.

The Sculls first came to OBI from Illinois. Joe commented, "The Lord led us here, and there was never a dull moment!" While Beverly taught grades K-2, Joe served in several roles including history and Bible teacher, campus security, Campus Minister and the Dean of Boys.

It was during this time that Mr. Scull completed a Master of Arts in Religion from Liberty University and

a Master of Arts in Educational Leadership at Eastern Kentucky University. He obtained Secondary Principal certification with the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI).

Then, the Sculls were led away from OBI to serve in two other Christian schools—one in Pennsylvania and another in North Carolina. Mr. Scull was a Bible teacher and campus pastor at one school and principal at the other school. Mrs. Scull became a tutor, substitute teacher, fourth grade teacher and K-3 Bible teacher.

In February, 2023, the Sculls were visiting their son who lives in the area, and decided to stop by OBI to see the campus. After greeting former coworkers and touring the campus, they unexpectedly ended up in a meeting with the OBI president, who asked Mr. Scull to consider the position of principal. Mrs. Scull would meet a need for a tutor in the lower school.

Believing the Lord confirmed their decision to return, the Sculls finished the school year at their old school and moved to Oneida. Mr. Scull said, "This really is God's doing. The last four years gave me the skills I needed to come back and do this job. We've just had that overwhelming feeling that we're home." As someone who once struggled with learning, Mrs. Scull is grateful to use her experience and skills to help younger children, especially in the area of reading. "I am good at laying the ground work and getting kids to learn what they need in order to continue on. Everything I do, I do with the Lord's help," she stated.

Mr. Scull plans to promote the OBI mission of *Education for Time and Eternity* by equipping teachers. He said, "In everything that we do— English, math, science and sports—we will promote a biblical worldview."

### **KBC-funded courtyard blessed from start to finish**

The multi-purpose courtyard located between the boys' and girls' dormitories was completed in time for the 2023-2024 school year thanks to a generous grant two years in a row from the Kentucky Baptist Convention. **Angie Gritton**, Assistant to the President, has overseen the process of designing and developing the courtyard. Her vision for the space began about five years ago when it became evident that the positions of the three new buildings—the dormitories and cafeteria—would naturally form a courtyard space. Gritton explained, "The students really needed a place to lounge after school and to be able to sit outside. My vision was to see a kid out there playing a guitar by the firepit, or friends sitting at a table doing homework together. I wanted it to be a calming area where kids could sit and unwind and have a retreat from the day."

The new courtyard creates community by providing a place of fellowship where staff, day students and dormitory residents can spend time together. The beautiful landscaping with features like solar lights, water fountains and rock walls make it an ideal place for special events and group meetings. The wood burning fireplace has a gas starter and offers year-round enjoyment.

God's provision for this space was evident in the KBC funding as well as donations of specific items along the way. We even saw God's hand in the design of the space with rock walls that form the shape of an *lcthus*, the well-known Greek symbol of Christianity. We know this space will be a blessing for the OBI community for many years.


