Honoring the Prices for 10 Years of Service at OBI



David and Pam Price are celebrating their 10th year at OBI. Pam's journey into ministry began in California with her missions-focused family who had ties to the Kentucky Mountain Mission (KMM). Her uncle, known locally as "Preacher Bill," was the director of the KMM, and Pam grew up serving alongside her family at the Youth Haven summer camp. After a 15-year career in daycare, Pam "gave in" to her Kentucky cousin's requests to move to this area. She said, "I was ready for a change. It was just God's time." She moved to Clay County and began looking for a

local church. Her parents recommended New Prospect Baptist Church because they knew the pastor through their work at the KMM. The pastor's name was David Price.

In Dr. Price's 50+ year career, he has been a pastor in four churches, a police chaplain, and a youth counselor with the KMM. He holds a Master of Ministry in Christian Counseling, a Master of Arts in Biblical Studies, a Doctor of Ministry and a PhD in Religion. He had been the pastor at New Prospect for about two years when Pam visited. Seven months later, they were married. David said, "Pam is a gift from God for me." Pam noted, "When I got married, I became a pastor's wife, stepmother and Grandma!" The Prices now have seven grandchildren, and Mrs. Price has had two of them as students at OB!

Four Students Baptized in January

Staff and students gathered at the Oneida Baptist Church on January 24th to witness the baptisms of four students. Last fall, Dr. Price invited students to speak with him if they were interested in baptism. He explained, "So many kids have accepted Christ but have never been baptized. Some do not have a home church, and we wanted to offer them the opportunity."

At home in Nigeria, Cedar accepted Christ when he was seven years old. "I always wanted to be baptized, and when I got a chance here, I decided to do it. Dr. Price knows me and knows I am born again. He made sure I ran it by my parents

AG Coleman delivers message of hope

Russell Coleman, Attorney General of Kentucky, shared a powerful testimony in a chapel service on February 28th. When we learned that AG Coleman had attended OBI for one semester, we invited him to come and share with our students.

AG Coleman shared about how God opened the doors for him to become an FBI special agent only to have his career path halted by a rare spinal tumor that caused paralysis. He recalled, "Laying in that hospital bed, faith became much more than a box to check. ... Faith became the very foundation I built the rest of my life on."

He found renewed hope and new career opportunities that led to him becoming the AG in 2024. "God's plan was a lot better than my plan. ... The job I do now is to work to protect you and your family," Coleman said.

He closed with Jeremiah 29:11, one of our favorite verses here at OBI, and encouraged the students by saying, "There is no limit to the hope you can have in Christ."

With many of the New Prospect church members on staff at OBI, Pam said, "We learned so much about the Oneida ministry, and it piqued our interest!" What appealed to David was the idea of interacting with kids every day. "Here, they come to us, and you get to be a mentor. It's just amazing!"

In 2015, OBI president Larry A. Gritton, Jr. asked Dr. Price to consider serving as a pastoral counselor at OBI. He stated, "God provided Dr. Price in His perfect timing to meet that

who were happy about it," Cedar said. At home in Aruba, Pietro had drifted in his spiritual life. He enrolled at OBI last August and said, "Ever since I came to OBI this year, I wanted to get closer to God." He chose to be baptized because, "I wanted to show my faith to everyone."

From northern Kentucky, Jackson felt a "burden" to be baptized. He said, "I had been going to church and doing the motions, but it was like a mask. I wanted to give myself fully to the Lord and to His glory." He described his experience saying, "Something changed. When I came up out of the water, I felt like the burden had lifted. I felt like a clean, new person!"

need. The Lord knew exactly where we would need Pam before we did! We had an unexpected vacancy in our daycare that Pam willingly and wonderfully filled. The Prices' servant leadership has been such a blessing. They have made OBI a better place these last 10 years."

Mrs. Price was the Daycare Director for four years until a need arose for a teacher in the Lower School.

In his counseling role, Dr. Price combines psychology and biblical principles. Students are welcome to request a meeting, and sometimes they are referred by teachers. Dr. Price is also the Senior Bible teacher and the Campus Minister responsible for the daily chapel services.

The Prices serve the Oneida "family" and community in many other ways. They cheer on our student athletes at games and take many volunteer shifts in concessions. They organize Sunday evening treats for the dorm students and fill and deliver Christmas stockings to local students. Over the years, they have ministered to OBI staff children by hosting fellowship opportunities.

In 2022, the Prices encountered a daunting obstacle when Pam was diagnosed with cancer. They persevered through this time while continuing their ministry in faith here at OBI.

Pam said her "go-to" verse was Philippians 4:13, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."

This season was particularly hard for David who had lost his first wife to cancer. A biblical principle that helped him was one that he uses often in counseling. It comes from 1 Samuel 16:1, "The Lord said to Samuel, 'How long will you mourn for Saul, since I have rejected him as king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and be on your way..." He explained, "Sometimes in life when doing the right thing doesn't feel right, you do it anyway. You just keep putting one foot in front of the other." We are all thankful to God that Pam is cancer free and will be considered "in remission" in 2027.

Reflecting on the last 10 years at OBI, Dr. Price said, "I always tell people that God saved the best for last." \square
